



Evacuate depending on the situation

~ Decide on the evacuation depending on the situation after the earthquake occurs. ~

Have you prepared the stockpile items?

An earthquake just occurred!

Take cover under the table and wait until the shaking settles down

Go to open spaces where there are no falling objects from above

First consider evacuating to the nearest park, open space, etc., and not be limited to the designated evacuation sites only.

Let's check our home's safety

Take refuge in your own home if it is safe there

There is no need to go to the evacuation center if your home is not destroyed and there is no danger of fire nearby.

Go to the evacuation center if your home is not safe

If the damage is severe and you are unable to return to your own home, go to the designated evacuation site or evacuation center.

Write down the evacuation center near your home.

Write down the earthquake-fire evacuation square near your home

Write down the park or open spaces in your neighborhood

Actions to take "after the shaking has settled down"

Gather accurate information

- Gather accurate information from trustworthy sources such as radio, TV, City Hall, Fire Department, Police, etc.
- Do not become confused by hoaxes or rumors that become widespread in times of disaster.



Confirm the safety of your neighborhood

- After confirming the safety of your own home, confirm the safety of your neighborhood.
- Pay special attention to households with elderly people, etc., who need special care and actively speak to them.



Cooperate with rescue activities

- Everyone should work together to provide rescue and relief support for people trapped in collapsed houses or underneath furniture.
- Follow instructions from city hall staff or volunteers from disaster prevention organizations to work safely and effectively together.



Safety confirmation before evacuation

- When evacuation becomes necessary, turn off electric breakers and gas main valves before evacuating in order to prevent secondary disasters like fire, etc.
